"Messy Drama uses comedy and playfulness to demonstrate that art making can be accessible to everyone because it is part of our shared experience of the world. I draw connections between art making and the social world which shows that art is not separate from everyday life but is very much impacted by the world around it. The different objects in the installation represent the overlap between the art world and our



public realm. By putting all these things together, I look at the ways art, objects and bodies are treated in similar ways. Beer cans, hot dogs, body parts, art works and clothing all made from the same material draws parallels between the effects of production and investigates how we are all both consumed and consumers. Motifs from traditional sculpture, such as the marble plinths that the objects sit on, mocks the elitism which still surrounds contemporary art, and invites the viewer in on the joke."

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Where in the North are you based?

I'm based in Lancaster, and I've lived all over the North West.

What does living in the North mean to you?

To me, living in the North is a vital part of my identity. Northern culture: the humour is funnier, the attitude is friendlier than the South. People care about each other more openly.
