


Richard Dadd, Puck, 1841 Purchased with help from a bequest by Dorothy Wade.

Arnold Monk was a regular visitor to the Harris from his boyhood in Preston until he passed away at the age of 90 in 2018. A nurse by day, Arnold had a lifelong interest in art, showing his work in the Harris Open and serving as Chairman of Preston Art Society. After providing for his family, he left the remains of his estate to the Harris, along with a sketch by LS Lowry. We are now looking forward to using Arnold's legacy to support the refurbishment of the Harris and activities for local people in Preston.

Dorothy Wade left a bequest to help us purchase a pre-twentieth century work of art, and we were able to use it to help us acquire Puck, by Richard Dadd, which now hangs in the fine art galleries and is a source of inspiration for children's and schools' events, as well as a popular painting with our general visitors.

Mrs Wade's niece says, "For me to know that the money Dorothy left has enabled the Harris Museum to secure the *Puck* painting is wonderful. I know Dorothy would be delighted to think that her bequest has had such a successful outcome"



By remembering the Harris in your will you can make a lasting difference, help to shape our future and continue the legacy our founder began.
