

Largely associated with the revival of traditional British textiles, William Morris was a figurehead of the Arts and Crafts movement. He shunned Victorian-era industrialisation in favour of handmade production, which ultimately led to the creation of stunning designs that still prove popular today.

### What Does a Brew Mean to You?

As part of <u>Harris Your Place</u>, we are working to diversify the voices within our displays and stories told, collaborating with our communities and partners.



The Second Floor Balcony of The Harris is a space that showcases the rich history of the museum, displaying a wide range of objects, books, and artworks that explore Preston's global stories. From ancient Egypt to modern times, our collections offer a glimpse into the lives of people and societies around the world.

On the Second Floor, we will be looking at themes of trade and empire through more diverse perspectives. We acknowledge that we don't always have the answers, so we are working closely with local community groups

and partners to reinterpret the collections, to learn and share stories in honest and respectful ways. Through this approach, The Harris aims to provide a platform for diverse voices and perspectives to be heard and appreciated.

Project curator Raj Pal, who is a curator, historian and activist will be supporting the team in exploring these subjects and providing his expertise, guidance, and experience throughout the development of the designs.



Through this project, they will be working with members of The Harris team, UCLan academics such as Professor Sunny Xin Lui and Feixia Yu, Director of UCLan's Confucius Institute, and community members to explore the theme of tea through this lens.

We will be addressing the interpretation in our Discover Preston Gallery, alongside the story of cotton and Preston's mill heritage, to ensure we reflect these wider stories and impacts of this heritage within our storytelling.







### **New Acquisition - Azraa Motala**

"Being a woman of colour is inherently political, especially when our identities have been stiamatised as a result of attitudes towards immigration and religion. Further fuelled by the media and cultural gatekeepers often promoting a narrative of "otherness". Unapologetic will challenge the rhetoric and provide a platform for an overlooked community of young British South Asian women based in Lancashire to self-represent in a society that lacks this authentic representation." - Azraa Motala

This portrait was part of the exhibition titled Unapologetic at Blackburn Museum and Art Gallery as part of the last British Textile Biennial in 2021. Unapologetic is a co-commission between the British Textile Biennial and The Harris.

Motala made a call out through South Asian women's network and groups, her own contacts and social media to invite women to participate as collaborators and subjects in the series of portraits. Once selected the women spent time with her in facilitated conversations about their experiences of identity, culture, misrepresentation and self-representation.

The group will visit The Harris when it reopens in 2025 to investigate the collections in order to interrogate the representation of women and the lack of representation of women like them.

Azraa's painting will be displayed in the Fine Art Gallery alongside a portrait of her choice from the Fine Art Collection. She will be writing the accompanying text for the label from her personal experience.



### The End of an Era

Some of you may remember the 'Sir Richard Arkwright' painting by Joseph Wright of Derby, which has been displayed in our Discover Preston Gallery since 2012.

We purchased this painting jointly with the National Portrait Gallery and it now has a new home for the next 10 years on display at their galleries. Be sure to check it out next time you are in London or look out for it when it returns in another 10 years!

### The Harris in the Community

Since February, The Harris team has been working closely with UCLan's Public Engagement team to deliver 15 activity sessions for toddlers and parents/carers to enjoy together. The Harris volunteers and UCLan's student ambassadors have collaborated to run these fun sessions at Ingol Library, Ribbleton Library and St Matthew's Mission.



These sessions were created by UCLan members of staff and themed around the subjects: art, maths, history, archaeology and poetry, with an aim to make the subjects fun and interesting to the venues' service users and to introduce people to some of The Harris' collections.

Activities took a free-play style and helped to stimulate the toddlers' senses. For example, playing with clay in the archaeology sessions, eating and smelling fruit in the art sessions, and dressing up in the history sessions.

"The project was an ideal first volunteering role for me on a number of levels. As a former teaching assistant, I was able to use my experience of working with children and one of the libraries I went to was in my local area. The project ran for a number of months enabling me to get to know other Harris volunteers and UCLAN student ambassadors. Finally it was great fun and a good introduction to some of The Harris' paintings /artefacts." - Harris Volunteer Nikki Tate.



This project has now come to an end, but since the activities were so popular, The Harris and UCLan will be kickstarting the activities again come Autumn!

### Harris Your Place Update

We are currently in the construction phase of the Harris Your Place project with our main contractor, Conlon Construction, on site. Today inside the Harris you would see a very different space, with our collection decanted and the internal space stripped back, removing the mezzanine floors, basement toilet block and staffroom.

As part of our commitment to safety, we successfully removed asbestos that was identified during building work. The transformation is taking shape as the first-floor rooms are being treated to their first fresh, vibrant coat of paint.

Down in the basement, we've completed the initial drainage, screeding, and waterproofing phase. This crucial step ensures a solid foundation for the rest of the project.



Have you been wondering how sustainable The Harris Your Place Project is?

As a Victorian Grade 1 listed building in the centre of Preston, The Harris presents a challenge for delivering the Council's net zero ambitions.

However, the new design is utilising a number of energy-saving and decarbonising measures in its renovation, including the replacement of lighting with LEDs, and works done to the building's fabric, including a full replacement of the heating system that will aid heating efficiency. Several air-source heat pumps will also be installed, providing the heat source for the six new Air Handling Units.



### Wondering what to expect when we reopen?

The most innovative aspect of Harris Your Place is the integration of our collections and removing the traditional separation between the library, art gallery and museum by combining these areas together to share our rich narratives.



### Have you been wondering if our exhibition programme will change in the redevelopment?

The exhibition programme will be more ambitious; through the Arts Council Capital Investment Programme, we have been able to upgrade the environmental conditions in our special exhibition galleries to meet government indemnity standards.

This will allow us to present loans from other museums nationally and bring in bigger exhibitions!

## An Interview with Conlon Construction

Our contractor, Conlon Construction, is a local Preston construction company. David Reagan, Site Manager, took time out of his busy schedule to catch up with Invest Preston about the #HarrisYourPlace



Proiect.

### Tell us about your job role for Conlon Construction

I'm the construction site manager at The Harris project in the heart of Preston, and I'm responsible for health and safety, along with keeping the build on track.

### Tell us a little bit more about the project you're currently working on

The Harris is a Grade I-listed building, undergoing a once-inageneration remodelling and refurbishment project, from the roof to the basement and everywhere in between.

It's been emptied, scaffolded, and we're giving it the care and modernisation it needs, while preserving the building's incredible historic features.

At 130 years old, the building has always acted as a museum. I visited a few years ago with family and couldn't concentrate on the LEGO exhibition we'd come to see because the building itself took me aback. Working on a project of such a historic magnitude is a career highlight and a privilege.

### What kind of work might you do on a day-to-day basis?

I'm on-site daily, walking throughout the project to ensure works remain safe and correct. One moment I'll be checking that we're working to the most up-to-date plans, the next I'm overseeing progress on the roof. Every day – and every hour, in fact – is different.



## Celebrating the Appointment of DENW

We're delighted to announce the appointment of Disability Equality North West as our new Critical Friends.



Disability Equality NW was established in 1996 as the 'Preston Information Project'. Initially based in a small office basement with only one member of staff and two volunteers, the organisation has developed into a large user-led service with over 20 members of staff and over 20 volunteers. At its core, the organisation prides itself on rights, equal opportunities, diversity and social inclusion for all.

Our need for a Critical Friend group arose from our desire to respond to the needs of our local community.

We chose to work in partnership with Disability Equality NW as their core values very much align with our own, in particular, the drive to make The Harris more accessible for people with disabilities. The drive for accessibility is reflected in our plans for redevelopment, which include an audio description area of the Egyptian Balcony for those who are visually impaired. However, we can always do more to ensure that everyone gets to enjoy this cultural space, and that's why Disability Equality NW have been appointed. Their collaboration, advice and suggestions will be crucial in developing The Harris into an inclusive space.

## Programme Advisory Group

### The Harris Volunteers

Our volunteers are always busy behind the scenes, including assisting with events such as The Harris workshop at Preston City Mela and helping with The Harris May half-term events.

The Fine Art Collection Champions are still busy behind the scenes assisting the Harris staff with Collections Care. The volunteers have had specialist training to be able to clean and condition check the artworks and they are updating original condition reports to monitor any changes that may have been caused in the move. They meet often to examine, gently clean and condition check paintings from The Harris's permanent collection.







A volunteer spoke about their experience: "This involves using soft brushes and small portable vacuum cleaners to remove dust and grime from the works and their frames' fronts, backs, and sides. After the cleaning, the condition checking takes place. Each volunteer carefully examines the piece and frame they have cleaned, and notes down any imperfection or damage that has occurred. We identify works and familiarise ourselves with them; and importantly - provide future cleaners and restorers with a guide to establish whether any new, further damage has taken place." - Harris Volunteer, lan.

The Harkness Project is digitalising and sharing more widely the Harkness Collection of Broadside Ballads given to the Harris in the 1950's by book collector John Henry Spencer. These have been used over the years by researchers and are a mixture of Victorian Street songs, poems, ballads and Folk Theatre accounts of Grisly Trials of Preston and events like Preston Guild. This project is in collaboration with Lancashire archives and UCLan students and Harris volunteers worked hard behind the scenes with the aim to make the collections more accessible.



"My role was to get it in a digital form that we can use later on to produce searchable catalogue and resources... I found it really interesting.. Almost exciting to be able to read the stuff .. and be with the stuff, I enjoyed that." - Harris Volunteer, lain.

The Preston Street Songs exhibition at Preston Market concluded with a live performance of the Victorian Harkness Ballads Performance by Jennifer Reid on Saturday 10th June 2023.


#### Sign up to be a Harris Volunteer!



### The Harris Youth Panel



The Harris aims to be more welcoming for young people and create projects, workshops, and events based on what young people want. The Harris Youth Panel is an advisory group made up of young people aged 12-18. They meet once a month on the first Wednesday of the month. Their role is to advise Harris staff on any decisions that relate to young people. Over the last year, the panel have been co-developing the new youth space with Harris staff and external designers, including making decisions about how the room is designed, how it is fitted out, styles of furniture, colours of walls and also the types of art from the Harris' collections that they want on display. The new youth space will be a permanent feature on the ground floor of the Harris when it re-opens.
